## Players to watch:

#### #1 QB Levi Lewis:

He was born on May 9th, 1998, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. He attended Scotlandville Magnet High School before playing for the University of Louisiana at Lafayette as a 3-star recruit. In his five years as the quarterback for the Ragin' Cajuns, the left-handed quarterback played 57 games, threw for 9,203 yards, 74 touchdowns, and just 18 interceptions, while maintaining a completion percentage of 61%. In addition to this, he also ran for 1,088 rushing yards and 18 touchdowns. He capped off his college career with a win in the New Orleans Bowl, leading Louisiana to a fourth-quarter comeback. He was named the game's MVP. Lewis also holds the passing touchdown record for the Ragin' Cajuns.

After his college career, he signed as an undrafted free agent with the Seattle Seahawks and participated in their rookie minicamp before being released by the franchise. After a short stint in the CFL, the Dragons now have their new quarterback.

#### #21 RB Antoni Montón:

Born on March 28<sup>th</sup>, 1995, Antoni "Toni" Montón is a Barcelona Dragons veteran, going into his fourth season with the franchise. The 1,69 m tall and 75 kg heavy running back started playing football in 2011 at the age of 16 with the Sueca Ricers, after also playing rugby and flag football.

The now 29-year-old has been a part of the Spanish national team since 2019 and scored the Dragons' first touchdown in the European League of Football. His abilities in the running game as well as his pass-catching abilities make him a versatile weapon for the Dragons' offense.

#### #3 WR Imoni Donadelle:

Donadelle was an All-State football player and a gifted track & field athlete in high school. He started his college career at West Hills College Coalinga, where he had an impressive freshman season that earned him All-Conference honors. He continued to excel in his sophomore season, catching 36 passes for 705 yards and setting the program's single-season receiving touchdown record with 12 scores. After his sophomore year, Donadelle transferred to Division II Northwest Missouri State, where he started all 14 games in his first season. He led the team with 40 receptions, 658 receiving yards, eight touchdowns, and 351 kick return yards. His 1,121 all-purpose yards ranked second on the team and earned him an All-Conference selection. Donadelle continued to dominate as a senior, earning him another All-MIAA selection and eventually a spot on the XFL's Seattle Sea Dragons after being selected in the 2023 Supplemental Draft.

#### #18 TE Stephan McCluskey:

Born on August 1st, 1997, in Motherwell, UK, McCluskey graduated in 2018 from Bristol Academy of Sport in Bristol, England. He played quarterback and wide receiver for the Lions

under Coach Ben Herod, leading his team to several undefeated seasons and earning the Coaches' Player of the Year award twice. He then played five years for the Northwestern Oklahoma State University Rangers before joining the Schwäbisch Hall Unicorns. In the GFL, he received the ball for 168 yards and two touchdowns, while also rushing for 23 yards.

#### #40 DE Derrick Brumfield:

He was born on April 25th, 1998, in Cleveland, Ohio. He attended Maple Heights High School before playing for the Notre Dame College Falcons. In his four years at college, he played 49 games and achieved 108 tackles, 37.5 tackles for loss, and 19.5 sacks. He won the conference twice with his team. In 2021, Brumfield began his semi-professional career with the Wyoming Pronghorns in the Indoor Football League. With 58 tackles, one sack, and one forced fumble, he demonstrated his talent. In 2022, he played his first ELF season for the Tirol Raiders, which he ended with 37 tackles, 4.5 sacks, 1 forced fumble, and 3 pass break-ups in the ELF Regular Season.

### #2 DB Dominique Shelton:

Born on August 18th, 1998, in San Francisco, California, he began playing flag football at the age of five and then spent seven years playing youth football for the Solano Mustangs. He attended Justin Siena High School and was part of the High School All-County Team in 2015 before playing for one year at Santa Barbara City College Vaqueros. He then transferred to Mississippi Valley State Delta Devils in 2017 and changed colleges again after a very successful season with 32 tackles and 10 pass break-ups in 2018, joining the Northwest Missouri State Bearcats where he won the College Conference twice. In 2022, he played his first season in the ELF after being signed by the Tirol Raiders. In eight ELF games, he recorded 20 tackles, 2 tackles for loss, 3 interceptions, and 6 pass break-ups. Before Week 10, he was released by the Raiders and subsequently signed with the Berlin Thunders.

#### #22 SS Lautaro Frecha:

Was born on May 4<sup>th</sup>, 1994, in Argentina but grew up in Ontario, Canada. Played for the Superior Heights Steelhawks from 2010-2014, before attending the University of Waterloo from 2015-2019. The 1,88-meter tall and 95-kilogram heavy safety played for the Mexico City Mexicas, before joining the Barcelona Dragons halfway through the 2021 season. He's now entering his fourth ELF season after a very successful season, which earned him an ELF Top 100 Nomination.

## Stadium:

**Estadi Olímpic de Terrassa:** Capacity: Approximately 11.500 After playing at the Estadi Municipal de Reus during the first two seasons, the Barcelona Dragons have found a new

The home venue of fourth division club Terrassa FC was built in 1955 and renovated in 1991 to host the field hockey competition during the 1992 Summer Olympics. ### **HC & Defensive Coordinator - David Shelton:**

He was born on January 29th, 1967 in California. He played for the Fresno State Bulldogs College-Football and for the Edmonton Eskimos in the Canadian Football League (CFL). While he was with the Eskimos, they reached the Grey Cup twice (1990 and 1993) winning the CFL title in 1993. In 2023 he started the Season as the Defensive Coordinator of the Leipzig Kings. He came to the Kings after three seasons (2020, 2021, 2022) as cornerbacks coach at Arizona Christian University (NAIA) where he helped the Firestorm to back to back playoff appearances. Prior to that he spent three years as defensive secondary coordinator at Santa Barbara City College and two years as defensive secondary coach at Justin Siena High School in Napa, California where they were North Coast Section champions with the top secondary in the league two years in a row.
